## Central Block



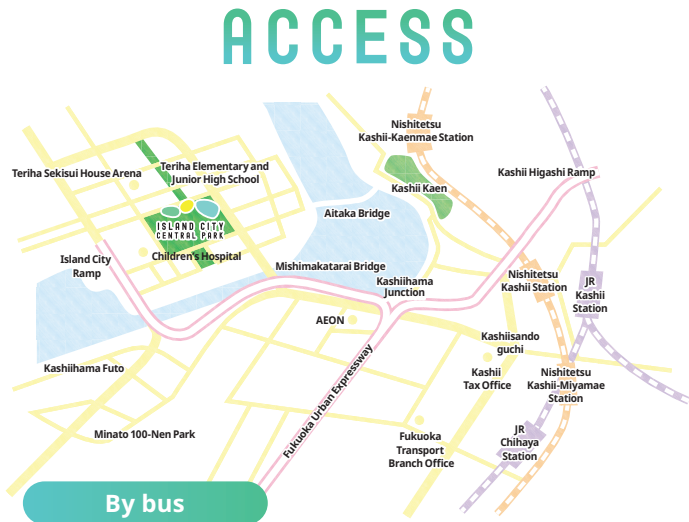
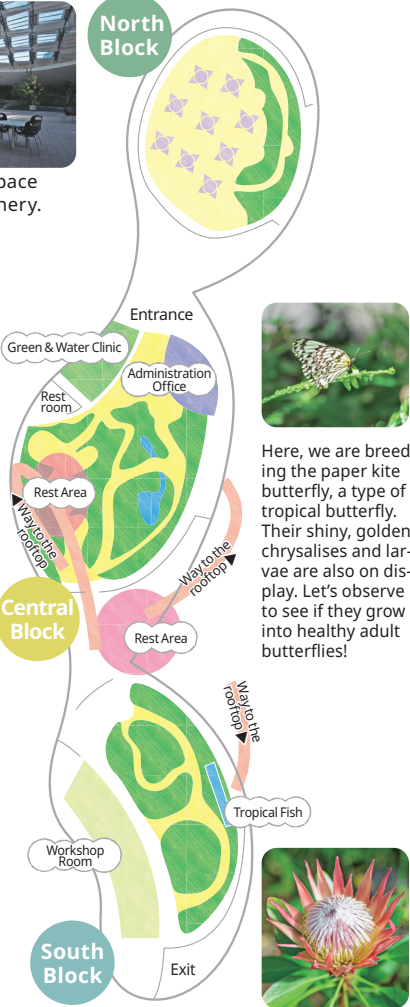
Many plants donated by Ipoh City, our sister city in Malaysia, are exhibited here in a recreation of the natural vegetation of subtropical Malaysia. With 650 pots of orchids on display annually, this space allows our visitors to enjoy orchids all throughout the year.

## South Block



In addition to the colorful plants, flowers, and fruit trees on display in the South Block, our visitors can also enjoy observing aquatic life in the large tanks of aquatic plants and tropical fish also being exhibited.

## By bus

From bus stop in front of the Tenjin Post Office, take the bus headed to "Island City". Get off at "Island City Chuo Koen-mae" bus stop.

## By JR Line train

After arriving at Hakata Station by train, go to the Hakata Bus Terminal and take the bus headed to "Island City". Get off at "Island City Chuo Koen-mae" bus stop.

## By Nishitetsu Kaizuka Line train

25 minute walk from Kashioka-Kaenmae Station on the Nishitetsu Kaizuka Line

## By car

Fukuoka Expressway Route No. 6 (Island City Line) Exit the expressway on the "Island City Ramp" and make a right turn at the "Island City Chuo" traffic light, then another right turn at the "Teriha Sekisui House Arena" traffic light.

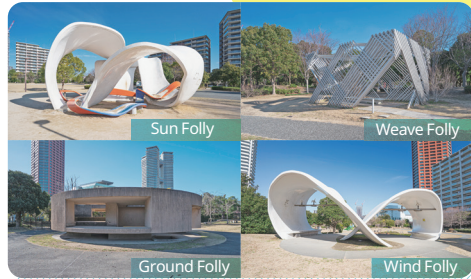

## Experiential Learning Facility GRIN-GRIN



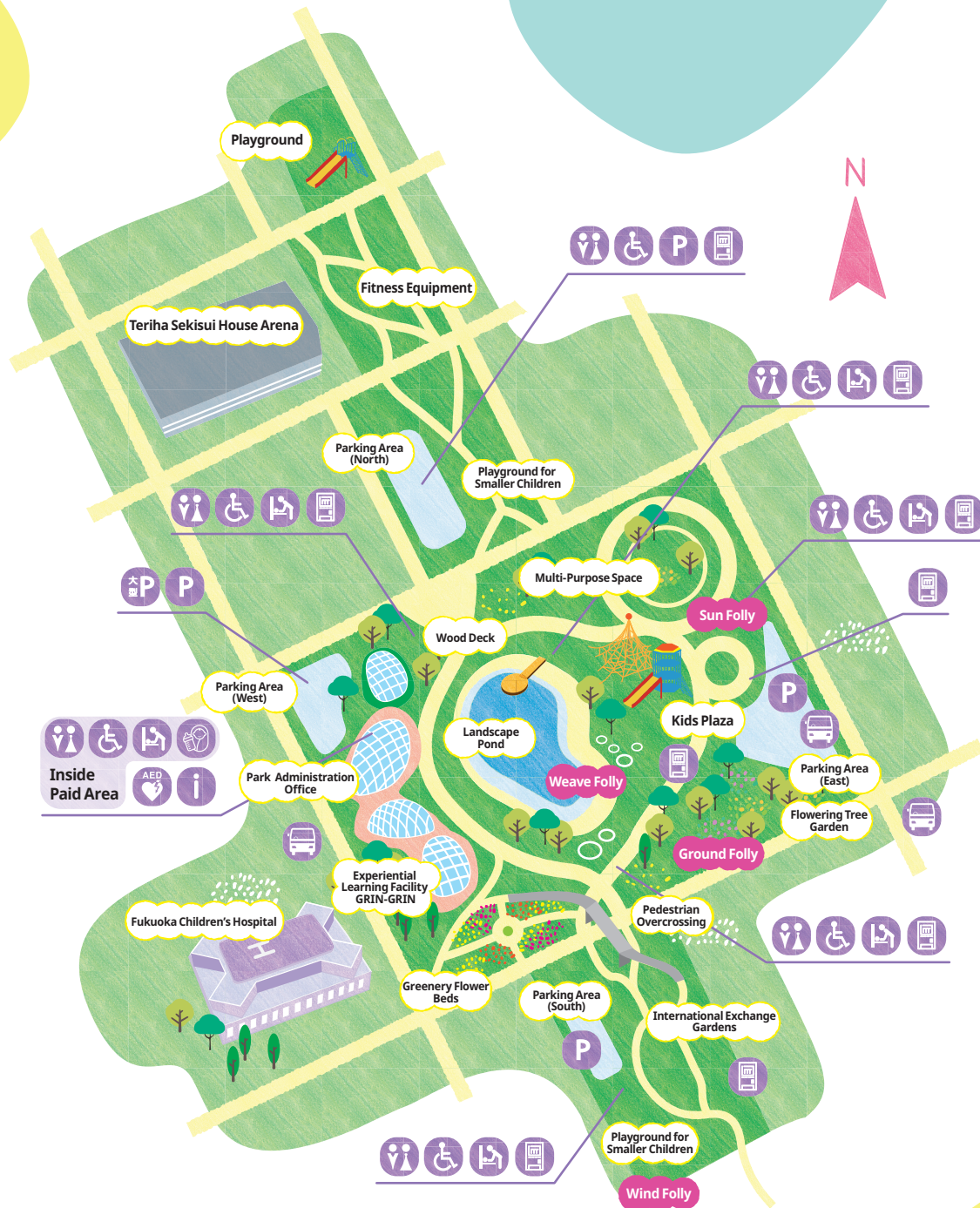

## Multi-Purpose Space



The Multi-Purpose Space is an open lot that can be used freely for play. Within the approximately 90 m and 50 m-large circular grassy areas are a number of benches as well. This space can be used for all kinds of leisure; run around with your kids and play with balls or just spread out a picnic blanket and relax.

## Kids Plaza



The "BIG TREE" is a large playground located near the east parking area. In addition to a large roller slide, it also features four other different-shaped slides, a suspension bridge, spiral stairs, and athletic features. There is also a wide range of other playground equipment for younger children, including steering wheels, grab-and-spin gears, and small slides. The playground surface is made of resilient rubber to ensure safety.
